## WHAT NOT TO PUT IN YOUR BioMaze® SYSTEM

- Fats, oils and grease are not water-soluble. They do not breakdown or dissolve in the water. Instead, they float on the top of the water and can cause a layer of scum to form in the septic tank. Over the layer of scum will mix with other items, such as soap residue and can form a hard crust.
- Do not flush “flushable wipes”, baby wipes, paper towels, disposable diapers, feminine hygiene products, cigarette butts, coffee grounds, bandages, or condoms in your toilets or wastewater system. Flushable wipes do not dissolve in the septic tank and will remain in the tank, potentially causing clogging, until they are pumped out by a septic contractor.
- Do not use strong toilet bowl cleaners, plumbing cleaners, toilet bowl tablets/hangers.
- Avoid using excessive amounts of laundry detergent or pods.
- Use fabric softener sheets rather than liquids.
- Avoid using excessive amounts of anti-bacterial soaps, disinfectants and bleach.
- Do not put pesticides, herbicides, paints, automotive fluids, household chemicals, etc. in the toilets or sink drains.
- Do not dump mop bucket water in the toilets or sinks.
- Do not dispose of home brewery waste, strong medicines or antibiotics in the toilet.
- Spread laundry out over several days instead of doing all in one day each week.
- Do not connect other sources of water to your septic system, i.e. water softener backwash, roof drains, AC drains, etc.

Remember, your BioMaze® functions as a living ecosystem by promoting a population of good microorganisms that treat the waste in the septic tank. Treat it as you would a fish tank. Do not put anything down the sink or toilet that would harm fish in a fish tank.
